Military Records

In recognition of Armistice Day on November 11th, both The Genealogist and Find My Past have added Military Records to their collections.

The Genealogist. "This release of over 40,000 Rolls of Honour, over 65,000 Medal awards and over 1.5 Million War Memorial Records significantly adds to the suite of fully searchable Military records on our website.

The new War Memorials can be searched from the our Master Search or by locating the memorial on the georeferenced maps displayed on their Map Explorer™."

Find my past. "Over **6.5 million new records** have been added to Findmypast this week, in the form of this brand-new collection. It contains the names of men and women who were awarded campaign medals during the First World War. You'll typically find their name, rank, regiment or unit, medals awarded, theatre of war, and any additional notes."

DNA News

2FA. - The DNA world, like many others, likes acronyms.

Here's the next 3-letter one of note. You will have met it before in many online applications that really need to know that you are who you say you are. It has of course been around a while for a number of websites, but at the moment it is flavour of the month at the DNA companies.

2FA – Two-Factor Authentication, or 2SV – Two Step Verification.

All the main DNA testing companies have been taking steps to make our DNA, and that of our matches more secure, driven by the "credential stuffing" that occurred at 23andme.

Many of the tools and services that we take for granted to help us analyse our results, have been suspended or disrupted at different sites.

All the main testing companies are now requiring 2FA, or warning that it soon will be.

And requiring that passwords be changed – with the very sensible warning that you should NOT re-use passwords from other sites.

The blogs from each company:

MyHeritage:

Downloads of your match and chromosome detail files are currently unavailable.

https://blog.myheritage.com/2023/11/securing-your-myheritage-account-with-two-factor-authentication/which includes this statement: "As described above, we recommend adding Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) to your MyHeritage account. It will soon become a mandatory requirement for our DNA customers"

23andme:

Currently does not display shared matches. No ability to download match /chromosome data.

Ancestry:

Ancestry has been warning for a while that two-step verification will soon be mandatory. Help file on Two-step Verification: https://support.ancestry.com/s/article/Two-step-Verification? https://support.ancestry.com/s/article/Two-step-Verific

FamilyTreeDNA:

The Group Administrator newsletter has advised that FTDNA has temporarily disabled downloads of your match and chromosome details while it is working on instituting 2 Factor Authentication.

When it returns, these downloads will only be available for those who have tested at FTDNA or have paid the unlock fee to the tools after transferring their DNA to FTDNA.

Until further notice, 23Andme autosomal transfers are no longer accepted.

Summary:

Hopefully once all this has settled down, with 2FA in place, all the usual functionality will have returned. *Lorna*

November How-to Session

This month's Members only Zoom session held on November 6th, was another on FamilySearch.

Apart from general questions, we also explored how to check further on eg a baptism found on Ancestry that wasn't obvious on FamilySearch. Not that all records are necessarily on both sites, far from it in fact. On Ancestry when looking at the detail of the person being investigated, you can check where Ancestry sourced their information. Click the Source link above the individual's details

Members need to get the cupboard key from the library Welcome Desk, when you will be asked to sign for the key and show your membership card for the current year.

Computer Password at the APFHC

The APFHC computer password changes regularly: check the red Computer Help folder in the top drawer.

Please sign the red signing-in book found in the top drawer.

Keyboards are in the lowest drawer. Replace the cover on the computer when you leave and lock the keyboard in the cupboard.

All six computers have subscriptions to Ancestry, FindMyPast and access to The Genealogist and Roots Ireland as well as free sites like FamilySearch. (Use your own log-in to FamilySearch).

NB. Please do **NOT** sign out of RootsIreland, FindMyPast or TheGenealogist.

A microfiche reader is available and there are books on a variety of topics that can be borrowed. Boxes of copies of 'Who do you think you are' and 'Family Tree' are on the shelf. The Paraparaumu library also has copies of 'Family Tree' on their magazine shelves.

You are encouraged to save the results of your searches on a USB memory stick or send them to your own email address.

We have a printer if you wish to print a hard copy. Please put 10c per copy in the honesty box on the cupboard door.
